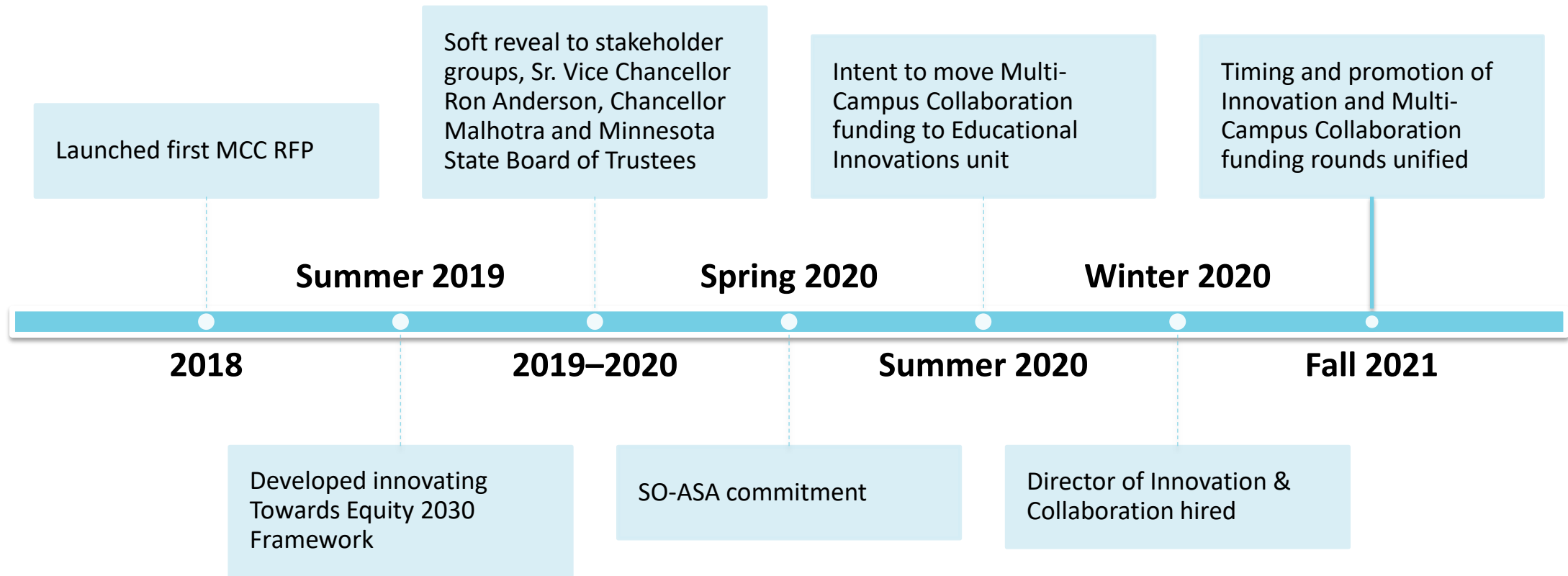

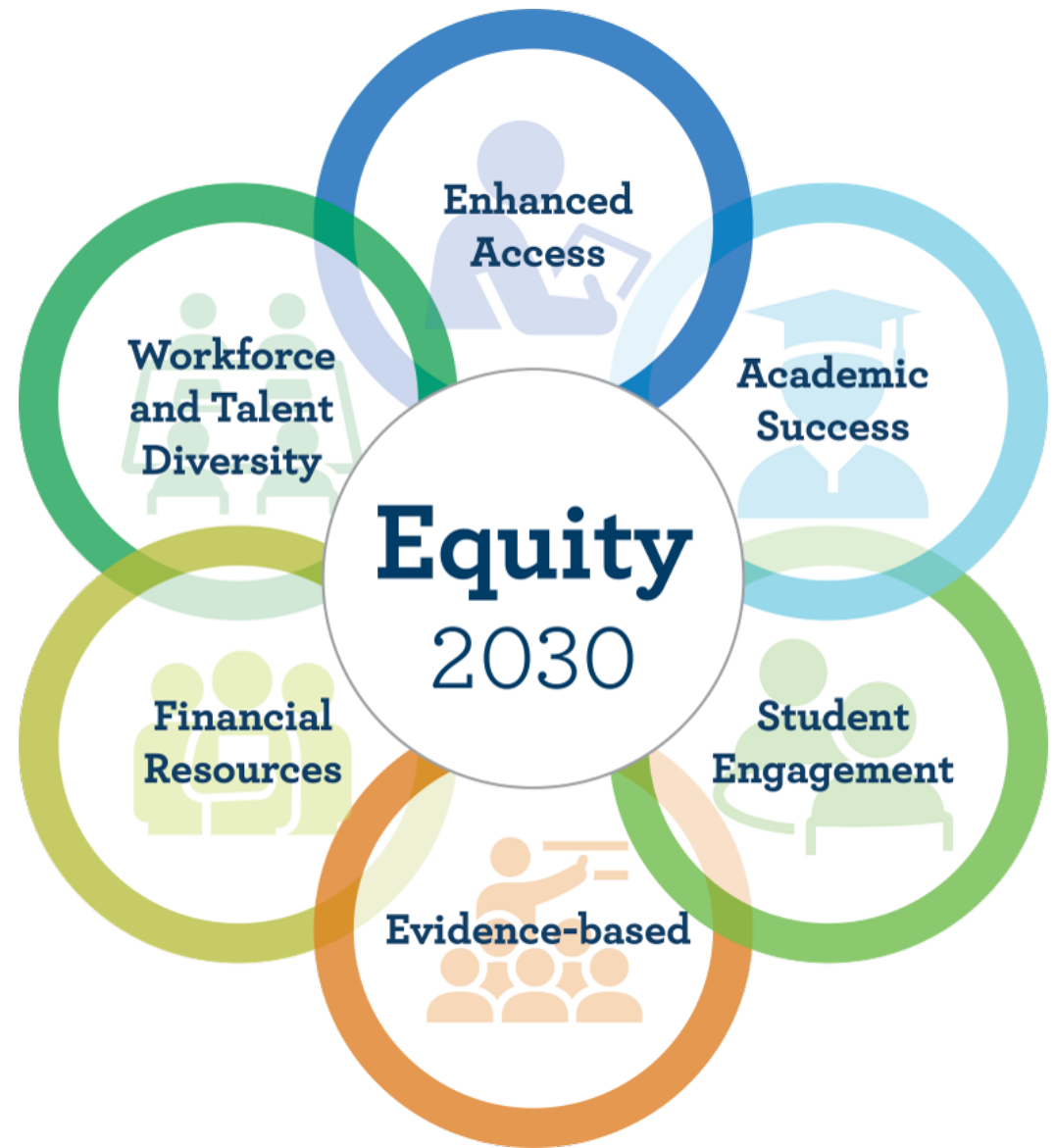
INNOVATING TOWARD EQUITY 2030: TIMELINE 2018-PRESENT

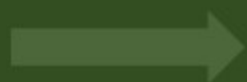
